only a few decades past academia tended to scoff at the very idea of serious pentecostal theology today profound and variegated theological implications of this dynamic movement are the object of exploration and development across the entire spectrum of the christian theological corpus arguably an acute need has arisen for identification and evaluation of the pentecostal movement's original and ongoing theological essentials what is pentecostal theology really all about anyway this volume realizes that pentecostal theology is at its heart a working theology undergirding and energizing believers worship of god in prayer and praise in holy living and in witness to a personal experience of the risen lord and savior manifested in the continuing power of the holy spirit authentic implementation if not explicit articulation of fervent pentecostal theology often occurs in the vitality of local churches house fellowships and various mission settings in america and around the world birthed in the fires of revival movements essential pentecostalism including pentecostal theology continues to burn brightest wherever it is fueled most directly

winner of the pneuma book award 2018 from the society for pentecostal studies pentecostalism is the most rapidly growing branch of christianity since the 20th century yet it does not lend itself well to a singular doctrine and there is therefore no single comprehensive account of pentecostal theology worldwide in this volume wolfgang vondey suggests an account of pentecostal theology that is genuine to pentecostals worldwide while allowing for different adaptation and explication among the various pentecostal groups he argues that pentecostal theology is fundamentally concerned with the renewal of the christian life identified by the transforming work of the holy spirit and directed toward the kingdom of god the book unfolds in two main parts illustrating the full gospel story and theology eleven chapters identify the spiritual underpinnings and motivations for pentecostal theology formulate a pentecostal theology of action translate apply and exemplify pentecostal practices and experiences and

integrate pentecostal theology in the wider christian tradition

*in the first critical study of the major theologians of pentecostalism one of the fastest growing and most influential religious traditions in the world christopher a stephenson establishes four original categories to classify pentecostal theologians methodologies in systematic constructive theology the four categories are based respectively on the arrangement of biblical texts the relationship between theology and christian spirituality doctrine concerning the kingdom of god and pneumatology as a basis for philosophical and fundamental theology stephenson analyzes each methodological type and suggests a pentecostal theological method that builds on the strengths of each he then offers his own original contribution arguing for a reciprocal relationship between pentecostal spirituality and doctrine that follows the pattern of *lex orandi lex credendi* and develops a doctrine of the lord's supper as a demonstration of this reciprocal relationship types of pentecostal theology provides critical insight into such fundamental issues as the relationship between theology and philosophy the dynamic between scripture and tradition and the similarities and differences between recent pentecostal theology and other currents in contemporary theology*

this book deals with the problem of pentecostal traditioning traditioning has been ineffective thus far because the richness of pentecostal faith and experience has been inadequately captured in the classical pentecostal doctrines of spirit baptism and glossolalia a more adequate understanding of the key theological symbol of pentecostalism glossolalia emerges when it is interpreted in the light of christian spiritual tradition within this larger tradition glossolalia can be seen as bringing together both the ascetical and contemplative dimensions of the christian life chan thus explores the shape of pentecostal ecclesiology as traditioning community

this is a book for students pastors teachers and theologians concerned for an approach to mission that is sensitive to their context who want to learn from a creative theological voice from what has been perhaps the largest religious movement in history and who see the immense potential in lively theology by christians of the chinese diaspora who can speak to the many millions of ethnic chinese christians this book will also appeal to those outside christianity who are interested in its attempts to engage with a complex multi ethnic and multi religious situation such as that in singapore

amos yong is the most prolific pentecostal theologian to date and his published works are so many that it is difficult to find an amiable entry point into his thought an amos yong reader is the first introduction to yong s theology in his own words it brings into one volume representative samples of the broad range of yong s scholarship including theology of religions religion and science theology and disability political theology luke acts and theological method christopher a stephenson perhaps yong s most insightful interpreter provides an introductory essay that both orients readers to yong s extensive theological program and identifies the most important key to understanding yong s theology as his most neglected work spirit word community a book with implications far beyond the boundaries of pentecostalism an amos yong reader provides an overview of yong s thought and a starting point for more thorough study in any of the major themes in his expansive corpus

the investigation centres on the role of the spirit in revelation which the author considers is best defined as the spirit of prophecy a survey of scholarship on the pneumatology of the apocalypse is followed by a study of intertextual connections the author s own religious context within pentecostalism then informs a possible hermeneutic that is faithful to the ethos of the movement biblical and literary studies are situated within the context of a pentecostal community as attention is paid to the prophecy concerning the temple and the witnesses in rev 11 this key passage is shown to form the theological as well as the literary centre of the spirit s role in revelation

in jesus name tells the story of the third stream of pentecostalism which emerged during the formative years of the pentecostal revival this is the first comprehensive study of the origins history and theology of oneness pentecostalism the heterodox movement expelled from the assemblies of god in 1916 for its rejection of the doctrine of the trinity and insistence on water baptism in the name of the lord jesus christ reed traces the movement now estimated at 14 million world wide to its pietist and evangelical roots its distinctive doctrine is a radical trajectory of a christocentric reaction that had already begun in early pentecostalism reed s study shows the inadequacy of the label of heresy in light of its thoroughgoing pentecostal identity and theology of the name of god this title was granted the pneuma award for 2009

this book is a constructive attempt at formulating a contemporary pentecostal theology grounded in worship and witness the theological vision expounded here is grounded in the pentecostal story with its emphasis upon the fivefold gospel the doxological confession of jesus as savior sanctifier spirit baptizer healer and soon coming king provide the basic organizational structure of a pentecostal narrative theology each chapter takes seriously these central convictions and allows them to shape form and reform various theological loci important issues such as methodology hermeneutics and theology as embodied worship and witness are addressed the result is a vibrant and integrative theology fueled by a dynamic spirituality

the pentecostal movement has been subject to some negative external assumptions in this enlightening and challenging book cheryl bridges johns argues that in fact pentecostals employ a powerful process of formation of catechesis which has enabled millions of believers to own and articulate the christian story she engages dialectically with the work of paulo freire a specialist in education among the marginalized as well as looking more broadly at the nature of all catechesis there is also an attempt to move beyond the rationalism found in a praxis epistemology

walter hollenweger a recognized expert on the worldwide pentecostal movement has argued that pentecostalism's greatest contribution to the larger christian tradition has been in the area of worship it is in the context of worship that people are saved sanctified baptized in the spirit healed and filled with the hope of christ's coming despite the importance of worship to the pentecostal tradition theologians in the movement have not yet developed a full fledged theology of worship in this multi authored work leading pentecostal scholars come together to construct a contemporary biblical theological approach to worship seeking to go beyond discussions that focus on style and trends these writers offer a distinctive theological vision for pentecostal worship that appreciates the history diversity ethos and global contexts of pentecostalism written for pastors students and scholars this work provides ample resources for those interested in examining the pentecostal theology of worship contributors to this work include biblical scholars systematicians and practical theologians the diversity of voices insures creativity of approaches and freshness of ideas with the maturation of the pentecostal charismatic movement comes a need for extended dialogue regarding a pentecostal theology of worship it is hoped that this volume will make a significant contribution to the dialogue

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this book is about the boisterous beginnings of the american pentecostal movement and the ideas that defined that movement during those formative years it follows a group of men who rethought the christian faith in light of their new experience of god thinking in the spirit aims to provide scholars and general readers who know little or nothing about pentecostalism with an introduction to the ideas of the movement's most articulate early spokespersons and to provide pentecostals with a non judgmental historical source to help them in their theological reflections douglas jacobson focuses on the individuals who formed the original brain trust of this now gigantic religious movement in a 25 year burst of creative energy at the beginning of the 20th century these leaders articulated almost all the basic theological ideas that continue to define the pentecostal message in the united states and around the world
